**#5-#10 overall SCOTT HEINEMAN (“HINE-ah-mun”) – 2B**

**CONEJO OAKS, OREGON - FR** **6’01” – 185 – Encino, CA**

**Coach’s Quotes (David Soliz):** One of the great talents in our high school area this year and one of the great talents in the CCL this season...on his way to Oregon for his freshman year, following in the footsteps of Jack Marder and Ryon Healy, both of whom played in the CCL at the same age before their freshman seasons at Oregon...a five-tool player that can play multiple positions...an early candidate for MVP of the league this summer which is saying a lot since this is the first time he has faced D-I level pitching...to show how much of a baseball rat this guy is, his coach at Crespi said Heineman could use wood bats during the season instead of the metal bats as long as he kept producing. He ended up being all-CIF.

**CCL:** One of the leading candidates for 2011 MVP...Hit .312 AVG with 8 HR, 11 2B and 29 RBI in 44 games...had 15 SB in 19 attempts.

**Pers.:** Never drafted...his older brother Tyler Heineman is a catcher at UCLA, who is playing ball this summer for the Wisconsin Woodchucks of the Northwoods League.

**#6-#11 overall ARBY FIELDS - LF**

**ACADEMY BARONS, LSU (Transfer from Cypress JC) – 4<sup>th</sup> year JR** **5’09” – 195 – Alta Loma, CA**

**Coach’s Quotes (Josh Taveli):** Super talented, blessed with great tools...runs extremely well, plays a good center field and swings the bat very well...brings excitement to the game...started his college career at Northwestern where he was elected to the All Big-Ten Freshman Team and where he starred as a running back for the football team, leading the team in rushing for the 2009 and 2010 seasons.

**CCL:** The league leader in stolen bases (25-for-27)...hit .281 with 1 HR,, 5 3B, 4 2B, 11 RBI in 33 games.

**Pers:** Drafted in the 27<sup>th</sup> round in June by SD...stringing together stolen bases without getting caught is a specialty, besides his 21 straight to start off the CCL season Fields had 39 straight to start off the season for Cypress this year...on his way to LSU in the fall.

**#7-#12 overall GREG ZBRACK – RF**

**ORANGE COUNTY PIONEERS, PENN - JR** **6’01” – 200 – Porter Ranch, CA**

**Coach’s Quotes (Jameson Wicks):** One of the best players I’ve ever been around...can really hit...great dugout leader that keeps things in perspective...been through the ringer a bit...was drafted out of high school, decided to go to USC then transferred to Penn yet still keeps a great attitude and love for the game...

**CCL:** A leading candidate for 2011 MVP honors, Zebrack had been at the top of most offensive categories since the season started...finished hitting .336 with 5 HR, 14 2B and 31 RBI.

**At Penn:** A first-team all Ivy League selection...Started every game for the Quakers this year...batted .336 with 7 HR and 27 RBI in 39 games...led the team with 9-for-11 SB.

**Pers.:** Selected in the 43<sup>rd</sup> round by LAD in the 2008 draft...CIF Player of the Year in high school.

**#8-#16 overall JEFF McVANEY - LF**

**SB FORESTERS, TEXAS STATE – SR** **6’02” – 210 – Houston, TX**

**Coach’s Quotes (Bill Pintard):** An off-the-charts athlete...was a runner back for the Texas State football team...a right handed hitting, left handed throwing outfielder/pitcher, he can do it all on the baseball field...plus runner, hits for average and power and has a great arm...was one of the top relievers for Texas State this year and can really throw hard off the mound (low 90s).

**CCL:** 2011 CCL Most Valuable Player...the leading hitter in the league with a .412 AVG and a .632 slugging percentage...had 2 HR, 12 and 21 RBI through 38 games.

**At Texas State:** Started all 64 games for Texas State this year...hit .319 with 10 HR and 47 RBI and was 12-for-17 in SB...appeared in 17 games as a relief pitcher (closer), posting a 2.08 ERA with 9 saves and 24 K in 26 IP.

**Pers:** Never drafted...his father John McVaney played for the Baltimore Orioles.

**SB FORESTERS, MISSOURI - SO** **6’01” – 185 – Normal, IL**

**Coach’s Quotes (Bill Pintard):** A five-tools athlete who is a real pleasure to be around...has great power to the opposite field...plus runner with a big-time arm from the outfield.

**CCL:** Hit .263 with 4 HR and 18 RBI in 33 games for the Foresters this summer.

**At Missouri:** An everyday starter for Mizzou in 2011...lead the team with 7 HR and posted a .267 AVG with 34 RBI and 20 SB in 48 games.

**G. ANGELENOS, DOMINGUEZ HILLS (transfer Glendale Col) - JR** **6’00” – 195 – Glendale, CA**

**Coach’s Quotes (Tony Riviera):** Sako has electric power that should carry him deep at the professional level. Someone I project to play at the major league level. Solid defender with an excellent arm and can play corner infield and outfield positions

**CCL:** The league leader with 10 HR...hit .248 with 32 RBI in 44 games this summer...was 10-for-15 in SB.

**Pers.:** Was drafted in the 42nd round of the 2011 draft by the Atlanta Braves.

**#11 ROURIC BRIDGEWATER - DH**

**ORANGE COUNTY PIONEERS, ARIZONA STATE - FR** **6’02” – 200 – Pomona, CA**

**Coach’s Quotes (Jameson Wicks):** On his way to a baseball powerhouse at ASU...big time power from the left side of the plate...had 14 HR last season in HS...been holding his own this summer against good college pitching...has been making adjustments with his stride and looks to be getting locked in.

**CCL:** Hit .252 with 10 doubles and 15 RBI in 31 games this summer.

**#12 RILEY MOORE - C**

**SB FORESTERS, ARIZONA - FR** **6’02” – 180 – Santa Barbara, CA**

**Coach’s Quotes (Bill Pintard):** One of the most highly touted prospects to come out of Santa Barbara high schools (San Marcos HS) in recent years...a left hand hitting catcher with a great frame and good actions...is only now starting to fill out...can see him having a great pro career...has been working with us during the summers ever since his freshman year, catching D-I bullpens has been great for him as a catcher and as a human being...we will be working him slowly this summer as his college career gets ready to start at Arizona...his best days are right in front of him.

**CCL:** Hit .231 with 1 HR in a limited role (26 AB) for the Foresters this summer.

**Pers:** Selected in the 21<sup>st</sup> round this June by PHI...the younger brother (by one year) of the Moore quadruplets.

**SANTA BARBARA FORESTERS, NEBRASKA (transfer Pierce JC) - JR** **6’02” – 185 – Agoura, CA**

**Coach’s Quotes (Bill Pintard):** A left hand hitting catcher with tremendous pop in his bat...have seen him hit some moon shots...good arm from behind the plate and is working very hard at being a better catcher...on his way to Nebraska after a good season at Pierce.

**Coach’s Quotes (Josh Tavelli):** The starting QB for the Bruins football team you don’t have to question his arm strength, athletic ability or leadership qualities...hasn’t played baseball since junior high but it looks like he hasn’t missed an inning...has all the makings of becoming a professional catcher... **SLO BLUES, KANSAS - SR**

**6’02” – 220 – Minot, ND**

**Coach’s Quotes (Chal Fanning):** The first and last thing on Zac’s mind these days is what his family and neighbors are going through back home in Minot these days...his family’s home is above the record-breaking flood that is currently taking place in Minot, but other homes of his family, including his grandmother’s, is six-feet underwater and his home has been opened up to house some of those forced out of their homes until the waters recede in a month or two...baseball wise, Zac has raw power...you can see why the A’s drafted him in the 12th round (2008)... needs to work on consistency at plate...gets into trouble when he tries to hit home runs vs letting them happen on their own...one of those guys that can change the game with one swing.
